LibreOffice

Back in 2011, a project to circumvent Microsoft's Office program was made available for PC users at no charge. Called LibreOffice it was a very usable program that easily did most of the same things that Microsoft Word and Microsoft Excel performed. The following year another program called OpenOffice entered the field. It was based on the same programming code so it had many of the same features. However, in the last year or so, OpenOffice has lagged behind Libre-Office in updates to its program. If you still use OpenOffice I recommend uninstalling it and downloading and installing LibreOffice.

Get it here: https://www. libreoffice.org/download/download/ ; then look for it in your *Downloads* folder and double click it to install. Choose the Typical installation and follow any screen prompts.

LibreOffice is faster and the text appears a little sharper on the screen. Because it's free you don't have to pay for MS Office. If you are thinking of buying a new computer, you don't need to buy MS Office 365's installed and annoying subscription program. This marketing item comes on most new computers.

LibreOffice installs easily and runs without glitches. When you open it, all the functions are listed on the left. Writer mimics Word and Calc mimics Excel. When you open a function you will see many icons at the top. Simply hover the mouse arrow over them to see what they do.

Two settings need to be changed in the program. The default file saving



format for Writer and Calc is different from Microsoft's. Microsoft Word uses .DOC or in their newer format .DOCX and Microsoft Excel uses .XLS or in their newer format .XLSX. You need to change the default file format so you can save your created documents in the Microsoft format so other email recipients can read your LibreOffice attachments. Microsoft Word or Excel users will then be able to open and read your documents.

After you have installed LibreOffice click Tools at the top. In the menu, click Options and click the + sign next to Load/Save then click General. Under "Default File Format and ODF Settings" and across from "Document type:" click the little down arrow to select "Text document". Just below and across from the "Always save as:" click the down arrow and select

"Word 2007-2019 (*.docx)". Click Apply. Now, go back to the "Document type:" and click the down arrow to select "Spreadsheet". Across from "Always save as:" click the down arrow and select "Excel 2007-2019 (*.XLSX)". Click Apply, then click OK to complete the process. You can "X" out of the Options window. That's it! I feel confident this program will fulfill your Microsoft Office needs.

We will cover LibreOffice installation and show you how to proceed on selecting the proper file format settings at the next PC Club meeting. Getting To Know You

I'd like to introduce our readers to a fascinating man and a delightful couple, Mark and Carey Gross.

Mark welcomed me into their home, introduced me to Carey and from that moment on the pace of our conversation was lively and far-ranging. The Grosses moved into Springton Village about four years ago after Carey, an interior designer, renovated and redecorated. Their home reflects their common interest in beautiful furniture; for example a William and Mary highboy, a Newport tall case clock, and a lovely Chippendale mirror that looks very much like historic mirrors I have seen in antique exhibits. Carey told me she made the mirror while she and Mark took classes from a local woodworker. I was almost speechless!


As we walked around their home, Mark showed me some of the results of his cabinet-making skills. An

incredibly creative, Stickley styled TV cabinet and a reproduction of a Chester County spice box, which commemorates Mark and Carey's marriage in 1964, exemplify pieces made in the Hershey's Mill Woodshop. At their previous home in West Chester, Mark converted a stable into a woodshop where he built several other large projects – an Early American corner cupboard, a French linen press, and a Philadelphia-styled drop front desk, all wedding gifts for each of their three children. Mark has also built two unique Arts & Crafts styled end tables which decorate the Gross' family room and were designed to display sculpture featuring Native Americans.

Together Mark and Carey have parented two daughters and a son, and now take pride and pleasure in their eight grandchildren. Mark has enjoyed

making numerous smaller projects over the years for every member in the family and he especially loves making boxes – recipe, candle, jewelry and pencil boxes. He's currently working on an individually designed box for each of the six grandsons. Every one will incorporate multiple species of wood selected from Mark's extensive

collection of exotic hardwoods.

How did Mark develop these skills? He credits his grandfather for introducing him to woodworking during his earliest years when his family lived in the Bronx with his grandparents during WWII. He watched Grandpa Otto repair and construct various items and still has the toy box that was made by him. In an effort to "be like Grandpa", he recalls taking apart a coffee table using just a screwdriver when he was about five. When he was 11, the family moved to Long Beach, NY where Mark learned elementary woodworking skills from high school teachers, in Boy Scouts (he is an

Eagle Scout) and in Sea Scouts. Using plans from a Mechanics Illustrated magazine, he built a 14 foot boat that he sailed off the south shore of Long Island and also helped repair boats at the local marina. Oh! And by the way, he also played soccer and baseball during both high school and college.

Mark studied biology at Fairleigh Dickinson University in NJ graduating with a BS in Science and then enlisted in the Air Force. Stationed in Waco, TX at James Connolly AFB for flight training, he met Carey in the lobby of her dorm at Baylor University when he came to pick up another girl for a blind date. Carey says, "There's never been a dull moment since the day we met!" They married in the chapel on Mather AFB in Sacramento, CA

where Mark was in advanced electronics warfare officer training before subsequently being transferred to his permanent assignment at Fairchild AFB in Spokane, WA. During his eight years in the Air Force, he flew 2500 hours in B52s and completed 65 combat missions in support of the Viet Nam Conflict.

After leaving the military, Mark merged his degree in biology with computer skills learned in the AF to begin a career in Healthcare IT working for IBM for 15 years before moving on to other opportunities which propelled him toward becoming one of the top Healthcare IT consultants in the industry. Like so many of us, he and Carey moved during his business career about every five years finally ending up in West Chester in 1991. Before retiring to Hershey's Mill, they lived happily for 25 years in a home designed by Carey that they built on property overlooking Radley Run, the site of Lenape tribe encampments and the Revolutionary War Battle of the Brandywine along Birmingham

Road...the perfect place for a man who loves history!

Mark is certainly a man of many interests! During those years of working, moving and raising three children, there was worldwide business travel as well as travel for fun – touring the US and Europe with Carey as well as fly fishing and hunting trips! During travels to the UK, Mark assembled an impressive assortment of Winston Churchill memorabilia and he participates in a book discussion group focused on historical topics. He also collects toy soldiers, woodworking tools, and plumb bobs – a passion spurred on when he inherited his Grandfather's plumb bob. Mark has also been an avid outdoorsman and life-long upland bird and duck hunter accompanied on these adventures by Brittany Spaniels and Labrador Retrievers which were breed and raised by Carey who he affectionately calls "The Puppy Queen"!

And then there's woodworking! Mark revealed that this hobby has become an integral part of his life, as recreation; as a continuous learning platform for building skills in a difficult, beautiful craft; and as a retreat from the stress of everyday life.

Although Mark is retired, like many of us who live in Hershey's Mill, he is still a busy man! He is a member of the Springton Village Council and he enjoys teaching basic woodworking as one of his roles as a member of the Woodshop Council. Looking for a new hobby? Take note!

Although Mark's wife made it clear that this article should be about him, I cannot write it without also introducing Carey. During this interview, Mark repeatedly talked about their strong partnership that has developed over 55 years of marriage. He says that Carey kept everything organized and moving forward during his working years and emphasizes that she has designed most of the furniture that he's built and matches the grain and pattern of the wood as his projects get underway.

Born in Louisiana, Carey spent her teen years in Houston before attending Baylor University. Like Mark, she was first in her family to go to college. Her career as an interior designer evolved from her studies in art and home economics. She says that she probably should have pursued archi-


tecture remembering that she started building to-scale model houses out of scavenged wood, paper, and tile in her teens. Instead she used her talents to decorate, redesign or renovate numerous clients' homes and all eight of the homes that they've owned. She credits Mark with teaching her basic drafting skills.

Carey also likes to stay busy organizing family pictures into Shutterfly scrapbooks, researching family genealogy, entertaining old friends in their Gourmet Group, participating in two book groups, and playing Mah Jongg, a new found love. She is also very proud of her participation in P.E.O, a philanthropic organization that raises funds for scholarships, loans, and grants to help women pursue getting a college education. Carey loves fly fishing too and has fond memories of adventures with Mark in the Northwest, Canada and Alaska. She also enjoys their garden plot at the HM Community Gardens. Naturally, Mark built a Nakashima-styled Japanese garden bench for them to sit on while they rest, survey the vegetables and flowers they've planted, and watch the birds that inhabit birdhouses Mark built!

Joseph S. Kennedy | Princeton

During the latter part of the 19th century, two of the most popular summer diversions were the Sunday school picnic and the day excursion. In a simpler age, these brought together people of different ages for fellowship, outdoor amusement and, in the case of the excursion, a little adventure.

As early as 1837, several churches in Norristown combined to hold a picnic on the Fourth of July, according to records of the Historical Society of Montgomery County. Many churches in the region observed this date as a Sunday school picnic day until the end of the Civil War. Most of these early picnics were held in a nearby private wooded area, such as Cooke's Woods at Sandy and Marshall Streets in Norristown. During the 1850s, Laurel Dell was popular. This site, on the Abraham Farm west of Bridgeport, near the Schuylkill, was reached by steamboat.

Valley Forge was also a popular spot and blended well with the Independence Day celebration. After the Civil War, churches used other days for their Sunday school outings as well. Activities at the picnics were varied. For children, there were games such as

tag, beanbag or baseball. Adults played checkers, pitched horseshoes or just talked. Depending on the size of the outing, there might be a local band concert or other light musical entertainment, including sing-alongs.

As with all picnics, the key ingredients were food and beverages. Popular choices included smoked ham. cheese, cold sausage and chicken, fresh bread, cabbage salad, raw carrots and onions. Dessert included fruit pies, cakes and homemade ice cream. Spring water, lemonade and peppermint water washed down the meal.

The food and drink were provided in two ways. Individual picnicking families often brought their own food in baskets. Each person usually had a ticket for a serving of ice cream or a bag of peanuts. Other times the women of the Sunday school would provide the feast and sell tickets. The proceeds supported the Sunday school program.

Church camp meetings sometimes turned into very large picnics. Camp meetings were large, outdoor, gatherings where church services were held. Local politicians also attended, to press the flesh. It was not unusual for people to bring a picnic basket and eat as they listened to sermons. In 1874, Montgomery County's evangelical churches held a camp meeting in Pennsburg, historical society records show. Many of the 6,000 people attending had taken the Perkiomen

Railroad from Norristown to the meeting. Services were held in both German and English according to one report, which added: "Little attention was paid to the sermons." It might have been that, while the gathering was church-related, picnics and sermons did not mix.



Beginning about 1865, church and other groups went on the Odd Fellows' excursion to Atlantic City. Men, women and children bearing baskets of food would board a train at the Mill Street depot in Norristown at 4 a.m. to ride into Philadelphia, according to the historical society. There, the

group would transfer to a ferry at the Vine Street Wharf to cross to Camden. From there, they would board another train to Atlantic City about 9:30 a.m. It was a long way to go for a picnic, but part of the fun was the trip itself. The return trip brought the day tripper home to Norristown at 10:30 p.m.

Upon arrival, we were warmly greeted with an opened door welcome from the hostess. Located at 106 W. Gay St., West Chester, the restaurant is a cozy, warm, and inviting space with seating for about 40. They offer a couple of beers and some very nice wines by the glass or by the bottle. If you choose to BYOB, there is a \$10 corkage fee per bottle.

Anthony Andiario, chef/owner, and his partner, Maria van Schaijik, have received numerous wonderful reviews. Recently it was awarded #11 in *Philly Mags* 50 Best Restaurants. Justifiably so! The food is delectable and the service exemplary.

The menu changes often and is limited to three courses: Beginnings,

Pasta, and Proteins. My dining companions and I decided to try several options and shared them as the dishes are large enough to do so. From the 'Beginnings' we had scallop carpaccio with horseradish green onion crema, sprinkled with crispy Brussel sprout leaves. The next treat was a buckwheat crespelle (crepe) with smoked pork hock, turnips and egg yolk. Our third choice, one of my favorites, was chicken liver pate on a seeded cracker with brandied cherries.

The house-made pastas are one of Anthony's claims to fame. We chose two. One was blue hubbard squash casoncelli with a brown- buttered wine reduction sauce, topped with shaved St. Malachi Reserve cheese.



Our second choice was Fusilli with mustard greens, red pepper flakes and fresh baccala (salted cod) topped with a parmesan cheese and breadcrumb mixture. This could have been my meal, but we decided to try a 'Protein' also. We chose Keiser's pheasantry chicken brasato al bianco with Jerusalem artichokes. It was probably the best chicken that I have ever eaten. It was brined in white wine and cream. The skin was a beautiful crispy brown and the meat tender and moist. Four of use shared two orders and I still had some to take home.





Recipe for Koulourakia – Greek Sugar Cookies

Cream together 2 sticks of salted butter (at room temperature), 1 Tbsp. solid Crisco, 1 tsp. baking powder, 2 tsp. almond extract, 1½ cups sugar. Beat in 3 medium eggs, one at a time. Then, gradually beat in 4 cups of flour. (If dough is too liquidy, add up to ½ c. more flour.) Cool in refrigerator for about 30 minutes and then mold dough into either doughnut or any other shapes. Brush with beaten egg to enable

decorations to stick. The cookies can be sprinkled with colored sugar, a cinnamon and sugar mixture, or with sesame seeds. Bake on PAM-sprayed cookie sheets at 350°F for 15-20 minutes until golden brown.

Mining For "Gold" ... in Our Golden Years

This is the first in a series of articles aimed to support all of us HMers as we age. Many of us find ourselves – too often – asking ourselves: "What exactly is so 'golden' about these 'golden years'?" We often hear, "Aging certainly isn't for sissies!" Definitely true!

These columns will provide tools and ideas about what you can actively do to cope positively with aging while also not losing sight of what is realistic. Changing our perspectives and habits is challenging work. But, if you can garner courage and chutzpah, you can find new ways to "mine" for your own version of "gold" in these "golden years".

The first few columns will deal with the subjects of loss, grief and bereavement. Grief can result from many forms of loss: losing a spouse, parent, best friend, adult child or beloved pet. Grief can also be aroused from other stressful events such as changes in financial situations, changes in our hearing or eyesight or a serious illness diagnosis – or even just the anxiety of worrying about a medical test. Aging clearly brings many situations which must be grieved.

Did you know that it takes action to move through grief, not just the passage of time? Consider this: What if you broke your arm and just waited for it to heal. Would your arm heal prop-

erly? Absolutely not. It is the same with the grief of a broken heart. One needed action involves talking with others about specifics of our grief, but the majority of people think they must "keep it to themselves" until they feel better. This rumination keeps us stuck in our grief.

As a support for taking such action, this spring a new program is starting: **The Grief Recovery Program**, facilitated by a professional grief counselor, Natalia Volz of Swarthmore. 

Have you seen the new Tennis Pavilion? This is one example of what HMSG has accomplished. The pavilion between the pickleball courts and bocce was originally constructed for tennis and bocce. When two tennis courts were converted to pickleball, there was no shaded area for the remaining tennis courts. This new pavilion makes not only an attractive entrance to the sports complex but also provides needed shade for tennis players and spectators. HMSG provided stimulus funding which the master association supplemented. The resurfacing of the pickleball courts with permanent nets is another example of cooperative funding with the master association.

HMSG also has a social side. The HMSG sponsors self-funded Memorial Day, July 4 and Labor Day events that mix play and socialization with food and libations. Most individual activities have their own social functions. Pickleball has several Wednesday night pizza parties following play. Bocce and billiards offer similar social gatherings.

Because access to our community's sports facilities is part of our HOA fees, the HMSG charges no dues. Last year a volunteer contribution program was instituted and we raised \$2,500. This year we are again asking for contributions with suggested levels of \$10 for a supporting member, \$25 for a sustaining member, \$50 for a Goldstar member. Attractive and reasonably priced HMSG hats will be available to purchase.

Mark your calendar for Wednesday, May 22 and Thursday, May 23, just before Memorial Day, for our inaugural HMSG Sports/Social EXPO. Free wine, beer, soft drinks and snacks will be served at the Community Center from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. on the 22nd. Each sporting activity will staff a table with information on their sport and how you can participate. Come, bring a friend and enjoy! Thursday, May 23, will be a come out and play day!

Hershey's Mill is very fortunate to have world class courts, inter-village teams, league competition, travel teams, out-of-town biking trips, winter paddle, year around pickleball, and a warming room for cold weather and socials. Here is hoping that you will become an active participant!





Don't be a Fool on April Fools' Day, make a Fool!

There are people happy to play you for a fool on April 1st, but we prefer to make a fool dessert for those we love – or for ourselves! Our go-to version is from friends in the Galty Mountains of County Limerick, where picking fraughans around the Festival of Lughnasa is tradition. Although out of season, good berries are easy to find here, and we think you would be foolish not to give our recipes a try!

Blueberry Fool

Simple and delicious is the Irish way. Irish berries are a bit tart, and short-bread biscuits usually accompany.

3 cups small blueberries, plus a handful more for garnish 3 tablespoons granulated sugar ¼ teaspoon vanilla extract 1 cup heavy cream

Crush blueberries with the sugar and vanilla until the sugar dissolves. Whip the cream, then fold it into the blueberry mixture. Spoon the fool into glasses, and garnish with a few berries.

Gooseberry Fool

The British way is a bit more involved, and here includes tangy yogurt (Greek style to approximate the Brits'). Most any berry can stand in if needed, but a delightful alternative is rhubarb.

- 2 cups gooseberries (or same quantity chopped rhubarb)
- 3 tablespoons caster sugar (confectioners sugar can be used but will lack a bit of color and flavor)
- 3 cup unflavored Greek yogurt 1½ tablespoons confectioners sugar 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract 1 cup heavy cream

In a saucepan set to simmer, stir berries and caster sugar with a splash of water until berries are very soft, then



mash with a fork until pulpy; rhubarb requires a bit more sugar and time. Chill mixture. Whisk the yogurt, confectioners sugar, and vanilla together, then add the cream and whip. Fold the berry mixture into this, leaving streaks, and spoon into glasses.

Blackberry Fool

The American way tends toward "more", as in this fancier version.

3 cups blackberries, plus a handful more for garnish

4 cup granulated sugar

3 tablespoons raspberry liqueur

24 cups heavy cream

2 cup confectioners sugar

8 vanilla cookies, crumbled

Fresh mint leaves

In a bowl, mash the blackberries with the sugar and liqueur, then let sit for 15 minutes. Whip the cream and confectioners sugar, then fold in the berry mixture and cookies, leaving large streaks. Spoon into glasses, and garnish with berries and mint leaves.
