



My Friend Bruce

Somewhere about a quarter century ago I met a man named Bruce Sellers. Like many of Bruce’s friends, I met him playing tennis. Bruce was the kind of guy that once you met him it was as if you knew him your whole life, so he fit right into our Tuesday night tennis group. He would often come late to play because he was driving home from a place called Hershey’s Mill, but he would always call and let us know his estimated time of arrival.

When my wife and I decided it was time to downsize about three years ago, we decided to look into this Hershey’s Mill place where Bruce worked. It was close to our daughter’s

family in Newtown Square and looked good on Realtor.com and Zillow. After looking at various places we decided on a home in Inverness. Bruce was our point man and told us everything we needed to know about our new home, village and the HM lifestyle. He even talked me up to the Mill’s tennis community to the point that they snagged me for the team right away.

I would often see Bruce working at various locales and he would always take the time to catch me up with the news of my Berks County pals. I watched him dig out the path from Inverness to Merrifield and, when it was completed, I told him my wife. I christened it the “Bruce Bypass”.

It is with extreme sadness that I write this paragraph. Bruce collapsed and died recently while working on a project in Eaton Village. He was only 62 and left behind a beautiful wife and a blended family of seven kids. At his packed memorial in Berks County, a contingent of workers from Hershey’s Mill were there to pay their respects. Mike Neale, his landscaping partner of 35 years, gave a heartfelt eulogy that brought a tear to my eyes.

The consensus of the people around Hershey’s Mill, as well as anyone else who ever had the pleasure to know Bruce, was that he was one of the nicest men they had the pleasure of knowing. I can attest to that wholeheartedly. My wife can no longer walk great distances but I still take her down the Bruce Bypass in her wheelchair and we will always remember our good friend.

Another Benefit of Living in Hershey's Mill

As residents of this wonderful Hershey's Mill community, we enjoy many benefits. There are a wide variety of sport, hobby and social organizations to choose from. We also have many services which make our lives so much easier. One service we may hardly give a thought to is the disposal of our waste water.

Did you know that 17 miles of pipe, connect each village to the Green Hill Sewer Plant? Every foot of that pipeline is routinely video inspected and cleaned every five years on a rotating cycle. Our sewer plant, located across from the Golf Club, has been in service for 38 years. Currently under the capable management of Plant Opera-

tor Jerred Golden and Managing Agent Ed McFalls, the Greenhill Sewer Plant processes over 80 million gallons of waste water each year. The plant also serves Wellington and the Giant Shopping Center.

In addition to daily operation, the Green Hill Sewer Plant must meet state and local regulations and operators continually work to minimize noise, odors and impact to the environment. For those who enjoy the golf course, 70 million gallons of treated effluent water from the plant is used to keep the course green and beautiful.

The Green Hill Sewer Association Board of Directors, composed of Hershey's Mill residents, ensures




that all facets of plant operation, maintenance & finance are for the benefit of residents. In spite of major capital improvement over the past few years, the operation of the Green Hill Sewer Plant is accomplished very economically. The good news is that only \$66.33 per quarter is charged to each household by the Green Hill Sewer

Association through the Master Association as part of your monthly/quarterly assessments. This covers all costs related to the plant as well as reserves for future replacements and improvements.

You may wonder how our sewage disposal costs compare to our neighboring communities. If you take a look at the accompanying bar graph you will be pleasantly surprised. As you can see, we all benefit from this well managed plant!



Domestic White Wines

Two thirds of the wines consumed in the United States are grown and produced here, only a third are imported.

All US States now produce wine - even Alaska - but about 85% of the wines come from California, about 5% from Washington State, and 3.5% from New York State. All the other states combined contribute the remaining 7%!

The first wine in the US was made in 1562 in - who would have thought it? - Jacksonville, Florida by French Huguenots. They used the local Scuppernong grapes that are today called Muscadine, to make a sweet white wine.

As more white wines are consumed than red ones, let us have a look at the most popular American White Wines today.

Chardonnay originated in the French Burgundy region, around the very small town of Chardonnay. The green-skinned grape is grown all over the world. There are many different styles of Chardonnay, from poor to very good. When it is oak aged, it's more buttery, when unoaked it's

fruitier and more crisp. Depending on where it is grown, it can be light, with some acidity and flavors of apple and pear when grown in cooler regions, or heavier with peach and melon flavors when grown in warmer regions. We have both in this country, even in California. I like the Chateau Ste Michelle Indian Wells, the Kendall Jackson and the Mirassou.

Pinot Gris, also called Pinot Grigio, also originated in the Burgundy region. It is a dark blue grape and is a close relative of the Pinot Noir grape. Pinot Gris is an easy-to-drink wine, from fairly neutral to flavorful, with some tropical fruit flavors. I like the Santa Margherita, the Cavit and the Ecco Domani.

Sauvignon Blanc, also called Fume Blanc, originated in the French Bordeaux region. It is a yellow skinned grape. The wine is elegant, crisp and refreshing with a citrus and grapefruit-like flavor. It makes an excellent aperitif, and goes well with fish, salads and chicken, and even with sushi. I like the Robert Mondavi Napa Valley, the Chateau Ste Michelle Columbia Valley and

Walmart's Oak Leaf (that is absolutely amazing for around four dollars!).

Riesling originated in the Rhine region of Germany. It is a yellow grape that sometimes gets darker, even bluish. This is a flavory, sometimes almost perfumed wine with high acidity that is made in three essential styles: dry, semi-sweet or sweet. It has lime and apricot flavors, but can vary on the region where it is grown. Washington State and the Finger Lakes produce excellent Rieslings, but in California it is seen only infrequently. Riesling goes very well with Asian foods. I like the Biltmore from North Carolina, the Kenwood "Sonoma County" and the Chateau Ste Michelle Dry Riesling of Washington State.

White Zinfandel. The Zinfandel grape grows only in this country and in Australia. It most probably came

originally from the Primitivo grapes from the Udine region in the heel of Italy. It is a dark blue, almost black grape that gives a not very sophisticated semi-sweet wine with low alcohol, only 9-10%, that can be blush pink to almost white. White Zinfandel was first made by accident in Napa in 1975. I regret that fully 85% of the Zinfandel harvested now is used to make white wine, because the red Zinfandel is a much better and more interesting wine.

There are of course many other white wines, both from individual grapes or blends, but the above five cover over 90% of the US consumption.






Windows 10 – New Feature Updates

Microsoft has started rolling out their newest version of Feature Updates for Windows 10. This means not everyone will get it immediately. They are doing this to make sure there are no major flaws in the update. If you want to check what version you have, click Settings, click System, scroll down to About and click it. Scroll down again to Windows specifications to view your version. The present common versions are 1803, 1809 and the newest is 1903.

Feature Updates are the major updates released twice per year. Briefly, 1803 has been the most stable recent version. Version 1809 was introduced last October with a major flaw of deleting your personal files. That was quickly corrected but Microsoft has not fully released it to all users. With 1903 now released I doubt anyone will receive 1809. The version numbers simply refer to the year and month of release, well almost. Microsoft sticks to their initial scheduled release date even if there are problems to be corrected which can delay the actual release.

Microsoft has seen the error of their ways and has implemented a change to the way updates are handled. With Version 1903 you now have better control over when and if the updates are installed on your computer.

When a Feature Update becomes available you will first be notified instead of the update being installed automatically. If you don't want to

install it just ignore the notification and your computer will continue to use the current version. It will continue to run your current version until the end of its version support which is usually 18 months after its release date. For example, version 1803 will end support on Nov. 12, 2019 and version 1809 on May 12, 2020.

Whenever you are ready to install a Feature Update go to Settings, click Update & Security and click "Download and install now". My recommendation is to wait at least until August 1, 2019 before installing 1903. There's also a built-in safety feature that will either fix or uninstall problem updates and block their reinstallation for 30 days. Minor updates, such as security and bug fixes, can also be delayed but only for 7 days at a time. However, you can do this 5 times giving you a total of 35 days delay.

Now for more good news. This change will also be available to users of versions 1803 and 1809. One other thing – don't click on "Check for updates" unless you want to risk the possibility of receiving a partially tested update. Microsoft uses that item to further test updates.

Finally, Microsoft is offering user control over their computer in an area that has been plagued with faulty updates. If you have been affected, you know what I'm talking about. We will discuss this topic at our PC Club meeting on July 16 at 7 p.m., upstairs in the Community Center.

Joseph S. Kennedy | Princeton

In 1684, eight years before the infamous Salem witch trials, Pennsylvania had its own witch investigation. But thanks to the careful handling of the case by William Penn, Pennsylvania was spared the hysteria that was the hallmark of the trials in the Massachusetts Bay Colony.

During the 18th century, people in both the Old World and the New World believed that witches existed, that they were agents of the devil and that their mission was to put curses on both man and beasts.

Early in 1684, a grand jury in Philadelphia indicted two women, Margaret Mattson and a Mrs. Hendrickson, on the charge of practicing witchcraft. The women, who were both Swedes and spoke no English, lived near the mouth of Crum Creek in what is now Delaware County. They were accused of bewitching 20 of their neighbors' cows so that they "gave little milk." The penalty under English common law for witchcraft was death.

William Penn, the proprietor of the Pennsylvania Colony, viewed the trial as a threat to his Holy Experiment, the attempt to promote tolerance among people of Pennsylvania. As a result, he assigned an interpreter to work with the two women and saw to it that the impaneled jurors were all residents of the women's neighborhood.

Penn then changed the proceeding from a trial to an investigation and barred the use of prosecution and defense lawyers. In addition, he appointed himself as sole judge for the investigation, held at Superior Court in Philadelphia. Thus, Penn made certain that he was the only person questioning the defendants.

Today our insights into how the investigation proceeded come from George Smith's *History of Delaware County, Pennsylvania* and Harry Emerson Wildes' *William Penn*.

During the proceedings, there is no indication that Mrs. Hendrickson was present. As a result, all attention was focused on Margaret Mattson. A neighbor, Henry Drystreet, "attested"

to the court that some years earlier he had been told that Mattson was a witch. Another witness, Charles

Ashcom, gave evidence that Mattson's daughter had told him that her mother was a witch and had cast a spell on the cows. When this testimony was translated, Mattson stood up and said, according to historian Smith, "where is my daughter; let her come and say so." But Penn declined to have the daughter appear. The testimony of both Drystreet and Ashcom was hearsay and thus, under common law, Penn should have allowed it to stand. Likewise, Penn's refusal to allow Mattson to confront her accusing daughter was a denial of a basic right under common law, according to author Wilde. Yet it appears that Penn knew what he was doing when he questioned Mattson.

"Art thou a witch?" Penn asked Mattson. She denied that she was. "Hast thou ever ridden through the air on a broom stick?" Penn inquired.

Mattson was reported to be confused by the question. "Well," said Penn, "I know of no law against it." "It is to be regretted that the charge given by the Governor (Penn) has not been preserved," writes Smith.

The jury acquitted both women of witchcraft but convicted them of being thought witches by their neighbors. According to Smith's book, the jury found the women "Guilty of having the Common Fame of a Witch, but not Guilty in manner and Form as she stands Indicted." Wildes calls this verdict unique in the history of English Law. Case closed.

In contrast 150 people were jailed and 20 were hanged before the scare faded in Salem Village. This is one reason why many believe that, in questions of tolerance, William Penn was a man for all seasons.

Recipe

This month's Vine Talk, on domestic white wines, inspired a new twist on a favorite chicken recipe. The French have Coq Au Vin, but in 1960's California we had Party Chicken. We made it with a whole butchered fryer and a French Sauterne, and cooked it in our electric skillet (with nifty adjustable vent) where it then lingered until we were ready. We've updated to handy chicken thighs, a white Moscato from Washington state, and uber-domestic Chester County mushrooms. We think it has the same magic as the original, although we sure do miss our long-departed electric skillet. And this version was a big hit with our newby guests as well. Give it a try!

Party Chicken

- ¼ pound unsalted butter
- 4 strips of bacon, finely chopped
- 1 yellow onion, chopped
- 1 carrot, diced
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 8 chicken thighs, skin on (or 9-10 if they are small)
- 2 tablespoons flour
- 2 tablespoons minced parsley
- 1 teaspoon marjoram
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- ¼ teaspoon freshly ground pepper
- 1 cup chopped fresh mushrooms
- 12 fluid ounces white Moscato wine
- ½ bay leaf
- Egg noodles (prepared as packaged)

In a high-sided large skillet (that has a lid) over moderately high heat, melt and lightly brown the butter, then add the bacon, onion, and carrot, and cook until the bacon is just crisping and the onion and carrot are just caramelized. Add garlic and cook until it takes on

just a bit of color. Remove all but fat to a bowl, then brown the chicken thighs, in two batches, in the fat in the skillet; turning pieces to brown all sides (chicken will not be fully cooked). Remove chicken when browned, and in the fat in the skillet, stir in the flour, parsley, marjoram, salt, and pepper; stir for 2 minutes. Add mushrooms, stir another 2 minutes, then stir in the wine and bay leaf. Return all previously-cooked ingredients to the pan, place cover askew on skillet, set heat to a simmer, and cook at least one hour. The sauce should reduce and thicken somewhat, and this can be controlled with adjustments to the lid. After an hour, remove the bay leaf, check seasoning, and serve the chicken, with plenty of sauce, over prepared plain egg noodles. The dish can also be kept, fully covered, at a very low simmer for quite a long time.


