# Message from the President

Joe Ciassullo continues to monitor the stucco issues and is issuing an update under separate letter.

Now that the snow has finally stopped, although replaced by hail storms, the repair work and cleanup from the plowing operation is essentially complete.

Painting of garage doors will be scheduled later in the summer for an early fall implementation. It will include painting of the trim and headers.

The Architectural committee has suggested patching road cracks before they enlarge and become potholes. We are looking into including this in the driveway seal coating program since the cracks in the roads require the same hot tar that the joints between the driveways and the roads require.

We will shortly have all the missing parts for our mailboxes in hand and will start replacement in the near future. We will send out a notice when the work is ready to start.

We are planning the checking/testing/ battery replacement in the emergency panels in each unit. We are looking at the possibility that the village will bear this cost since each unit will have this done. This way we will be able to know all units are current and be able to schedule needed battery replacements when required.

Mildew removal is being reviewed in relation to the stucco issue but we may proceed with the cleaning regardless. A decision will be made at our next meeting on how we are going to proceed.

Special thanks to Reiny Ludin, who has stepped forward to head the Landscape committee. Special thanks also go to Mary Ellen Marra, past Chair, for her many years of service in keeping Yardley Village special. She has also offered to help in any way she can in the future.

#### Note:

Due to the failure of KHovnanian to adequately address the causes of water infiltration of the stucco of some homes in Yardley Village and the decision of Council to initiate legal action against them, it has become necessary to address this issue with potential buyers of houses in Yardley Village.

The statement that has been issued to such potential buyers basically states that such legal action has been taken and the success or failure of such action cannot be predicted with any certainty. Furthermore, the Home Owner Association will incur costs in connection with the legal action and may incur costs of the work needed to alleviate the water infiltration to the extent that it is not paid for by the builder either voluntarily or through legal action. To the extent that such costs are incurred by the Home Owner Association, it will be necessary that they be paid for by the proceeds of Special Assessments.

Although it is impossible to predict with any degree of certainty, the size of the Special Assessments, it seems likely that in the best case, these Special Assessments will be approximately \$4000 spread over the next several years. While this may be sufficient to cover currently identified problem locations and projected legal expenses, the potential future Special Assessment amount necessary to address possible similar future problems, cannot be estimated with any degree of certainty at this time.

In regard to repair efforts, Council expects that invasive testing will begin on the problem sites on some of the homes within Yardley Village beginning during the week of June 8. The specific homeowners will be notified as soon as a schedule is developed. For your information, the invasive testing will involve removing approximately a 2'x 2' square of stucco where the high moisture readings were taken and exposing the sheathing in order to determine the degree of damage that exits. This action will enable a decision as to the amount of corrective

work that must be undertaken and a timetable to do so.
