Message from the President

Now that we have enjoyed the joys of the holidays, your Board is back working on the issues that effect all of us. The highest priority we are addressing is the stucco issue. As we discussed in the annual budget meeting, we will be accumulating additional information for a meeting with the Village homeowners, hopefully by the end of January, to get feedback before we proceed this spring.

One of the biggest decisions we will have to make is whether we want to stay exclusively with stucco or work in a different, or third, siding material on the exterior of our homes. If you get the chance, drive through some of the other villages and notice the different siding materials in individual villages. As we also discussed in the meeting, a \$600 quarterly assessment is being collected starting this month to fund legal fees in the Hovnanian suit and the first phase of stucco remediation.

Since we ended the year with only one fall snowfall, we will have some funds to put toward snow removal in 2015. Hopefully we will go through this year without exceeding our budgeted amount.

The biggest issue discussed in the Master Association meeting was the Pool House. The MA Board is pushing a total redo at a cost exceeding \$800,000. A minority number of village presidents, myself included, are pushing for a significant renovation that several of us put together that could be accomplished during an off-season, at a cost of under \$200,000. We took an unofficial vote at our annual meeting for which of the two approaches we should support. All that voted preferred the \$200,000 approach, none for the more expensive one.

Two other issues discussed were the extension of the perimeter walking path, which will begin this spring, and renovating the powder room in Sullivan House to become handicap accessible, which will hopefully be approved shortly.

Thanks to all that are keeping their outside lights on their garages on to increase visibility on our roads at night.
