### Message from the President

I hope all had a safe and happy Christmas, as circumstances have permitted. It seems like a suitable end of an extremely challenging year to have a Christmas day power outage. As mentioned in my previous newsletter, we have endured an unacceptable number of outages, six or seven by my count, this year.

I pressured the board to address this with PECO. Hershey's Mill was built with ALL electric service lines underground to preclude outages from affecting our homes. Unfortunately, the Mill is fed power from several sources of the "grid" since the villages were constructed over a long period of time and as sections were completed, they would connect to the easiest section of the grid.

The Board was able to bring PECO to the table for resolution. PECO agreed to install three transfer switches that would enable them to re-route power to areas affected by outages and minimize outage disruptions. PECO has apparently started on this project but regrettably have installed only the first switch in the project. We are in discussions with PECO to accelerate the completion of these planned additions, especially with winter being significantly more devastating for homeowners needing heat. I will keep all informed on our progress on this.

### Snow Removal

This past storm was a particularly difficult one for all snow removal contractors in the Mill. The heavy snow, followed by sleet, rain and freezing temperatures, made their task a significantly challenging one. Covid19 played its part with the ability to get sufficient manpower to do hand clearing and was a problem.

Our village fared better than most although a few homes were not cleared until evening. I received some complaints that the snow removal wasn't completed satisfactorily at their homes. The contractor went through getting everyone plowed out as quickly as possible, but due to limited manpower, wasn't able to do final clearing as they progressed and had to come back to finish. Thank you for your patience.

### **Community Center Expansion**

The board is working toward getting the Architect started on this project the beginning of the year. The Architect is charged with developing layouts, with our input, and renderings for the proposed project. These will be reviewed by the Township and priced by possible contractors, for presentation to the residents before we proceed further. The project is proposed to be entirely paid for through the CIF fund (funded by property sales) with no increase in dues/assessments.

We are entertaining the use of solar panels for electricity and geo-thermal for heating and air conditioning that could pay for themselves over a period of time and then save us significant operating funds after that.

The Board feels this is an important project that will enhance community interaction as well as our property values. We have negotiated the architectural fees so if we do not proceed beyond the initial phase, the costs will be minimal. The Board feels it is worth the effort and minimal costs to entertain this project.

### **Speed Limit Signs**

The speed limit signs seem to be having an effect on speeding through the village. Thanks to Roger Fleming for moving the signs and replacing them after the snow removal.

### **Seasonal Decorations**

Thank you to our decoration committee that decorated our entrances and street signs for the holidays! It adds a cheery thought to a challenging time for all of us. I received a note from Betty Ann Sapp, our Decorations Chair, saying she regretfully has to step down from this

position. We therefore must find someone to take over her role. She said she will help the new chair get started. Our Village runs on the efforts of volunteers and continually needs residents to volunteer for numerous tasks to help keep our village one of the best in the Mill. There are a number of volunteers that help in this effort and it is a great way to meet your neighbors, especially for new residents. Please consider the possibility for assuming this position. There is plenty of support for the new chair and we want to continue to have our entrances decorated and welcoming to visitors.
