Scams

Continue to be wary of individuals emailing and calling threatening you from Social Security, Amazon, and Norton Security, various banks (that you may or may not have accounts with). Most will not have proper identification in their email address and none, if legitimate, will ask for private information like Social Security or credit card numbers, especially if they called you! If someone like Amazon calls or emails that you purchased something expensive and are being sent to another address, call Amazon customer service at 888-280-4331. Clicking on links in these

emails can give scammers access to your computer!

PECO, in the event of an outage, to redirect power to affected sections of Hershey's Mill to minimize the length of an outage. They can't cut down all the trees or prevent vehicle accidents that disrupt the service to a section of the Mill, but will enable them to re-route power to the affected section of the Mill. This should minimize the need for backup generators, costing \$15-20,000. Although this has been done, if you have an outage, please report it to PECO so they have a clear picture of the area affected by the problem!

Covid vaccine appointments

I know there are many that are having trouble getting appointments to get the vaccine; I registered on numerous sites to no avail-until recently. It is really frustrating but the vaccine seems to be coming faster now so now is the time to keep pushing. Below are some sites to try:

Main Line Health -if you use their system, make sure you are registered in "MYCHART" and log in and follow prompts to vaccine appointments. I think other Medical practices use MYCHART, if so pursue appointments through them.

Chester County has a registration you can fill out and they will email you when vaccines become available. After I got my first shot from MLH, I got an email from CC telling me to select a date and time.

15toknow is a site set up to do testing but their site in King of Prussia is now doing **vaccinations**. Fill out their registration and hope!
