Master Association

The MA is working with our engineers to see what we can responsibly accomplish with additional storm water retention facilities to mitigate damage from significant storms like the two we experienced at the end of this summer.

Community Center Addition

We are nearing completion of the design part of this exciting project. Whether we bid out the project this fall or not depends greatly on the anticipated cost of the storm water management needs. We also have the cost of the sports facility upgrades that are planned for this spring.

Covid

The Mill is still following state guidelines. We feel it is best to stay diligent in staying safe, but hope things will start easing into the fall. There are so many differing approaches on proceeding; it is hard to come up with a clear path to follow.

Depending which side of the argument you are on, we are now able to get the

Unlike the original vaccines that seemed impossible get appointments for, the booster shots are readily available, and available at our Rite Aid (610-738-8870) and Giant Pharmacy (610-241-1061). It is best to make an appointment through the above numbers. You can apparently "walk in" but you may need to wait about 40 minutes, depending on their current traffic. Not only do they have the original vaccines but they also have the boosters. You can get a different booster than the original vaccine you received, you may want to check with your doctor for clarification.
