A program remove and lubricate all 52 interior unit gates in the community was completed in June. We had experienced 2 frozen hinges on gates in the last year. It was decided that a program to lubricate all hinges was required since no additional grease had been applied since Yardley was built 22 years ago. After the lubrication work was completed, the contractor noted that 3 of the gates have broken welds and will need repair. We are currently working to develop a reasonably priced source for those repairs. In addition, at least two units have modified hinge systems and further study is needed to assure the satisfaction of those specific lubrication requirements.
