Message from the President

Well, we made it through February, cold but little snow. Daffodils are coming up and spring is a blink away. Hopefully Covid continues to wane as spring nears.

Landscaping

We are due for mulch this year and will get it installed the beginning of March. We have been continuing our tree trimming program and have more to be done later this spring.

Fire alarm panels

Inspection, battery replacement and system check started a month ago buy was halted by Covid, plus a large number of homeowners that escaped the cold weather for the south. The program is to be restarted later this spring. An email will be sent out by CSK to reschedule appointments.

Architectural Review

The Architectural Committee made their village review several weeks ago. There were a number of homes that need some attention to keep the village in top shape. CSK has sent out letters describing work that needs to be done to individual homeowners. Most of this work, as stated in the "RULES and Regulations", is a homeowner's expense. Repainting of trash doors is one of the homeowner expenses. CSK got a price from a contractor of \$45 each that they will contact homeowners about utilizing. Colors for trash doors and decks must comply with village standards.

Exteriors

Any changes on the outside of your home, whether they are changes on the building or landscaping, must be submitted for approval by Council, through either the Architectural or Landscaping Committees.

For all deck rebuilds or refinishing, please contact the Architectural Committee -either Tony Bruno or Steve Keefer- for approval of color, dimensions and materials. They can be particularly helpful in moving your project forward as you start the procedure.

Community Center Addition

The CC project is progressing well. We are getting bids on the parking lot enlargement and hope to get this done this spring.

We are looking to bid the CC building next month with an anticipated start this fall.

Sports Facilities

The new bocce, shuffleboard and horseshoe facilities are scheduled to be installed in July.
