Storm Water Management

As previously reported, the Master Association has approved a project to add two 18" pipes to take the excess water from behind 1694 and 1690, that mostly comes from Green Hill Road, to the wetlands on the other side from Yardley Drive. The \$50k project, paid for by the Master Association, is being scheduled for later this winter depending on the weather. We will have some previous notice before the start that will take about a week, also weather dependent.

Master Association Projects

Very visible are the new Bocce and Shuffleboard courts across from the tennis courts. This major project will be completed in the spring. The existing Bocce courts will be removed and an open space will be left for lawn games. There are some improvements are being considered for the Community Center. The addition to the Community Center is still a good possibility some time in the future.

Please remember that you are required to submit, to either the Architectural or Landscape committees, any changes you wish to make on the outside of your home. Courtyards have more flexibility.

In January HML will be doing the winter pruning on selected shrubs and grasses throughout our village.

You may have noticed that some of the dead and dying trees have been tagged with ribbons, these ribbons indicate that they are to be removed, during this

phase of the landscape management plan, 20 dead and dying trees will be removed, replacement trees and areas that require reseeding of the disturbed area will be done in the spring. Additionally trimming of the boulevard trees that are encroaching upon the roofves and gutters of our homes will be performed. Both projects are scheduled (weather permitting) for the week of January 23rd, 2023. There will be several trucks and crew members working to complete the projects and there may be minor inconveniences to deal with, thanks for your patience and understanding.
