## Message from the President

## **Roofing Project**

The roofing project is scheduled to begin in March, weather depending, and is planned to begin at the West end and move through the village and finishing at the East end. If you have skylights, you have several options. If your skylights (skylights should be replaced after 15 years) are over 10 years old, it is suggested you have them replaced. KPI2 can give you an estimate for replacement. If you choose to keep the ones you have, they will flash and roof around the existing. Keep in mind that each homeowner is responsible for any

work needed on skylights in the future. The same goes for sun tunnels. I am not sure if KPI2 will install new skylights. I will ask if anyone has any interest. Please let me know if you have a present skylight and what you want to do!As previously mentioned, we are planning on removing all remaining dormers, because of the extensive costs to repair them, since they are very poorly built. They are architectural elements and are not part of the structure. Removal is included in the contractor's price. If you want to keep your dormer, which we strongly urge against, a majority of the repair costs will most likely be the owner's responsibility. If you want to keep your skylight please contact me. The existing gutters were never modified with enlarged openings for the new, larger downspouts installed during the stucco project. The new gutters will be suitably adapted to the larger downspouts, which will double the draining capacity and hopefully

The new gutters, with the new gutter guards, are guaranteed to be block free-for ten years, which will save us extensive gutter cleaning costs and aggravation!

## **Paving project**

We are planning to repave the streets and driveways in two years. The crack sealing work we have done over the past few years has prolonged the life of our paving. Unless there is a substantial increase in the cost of asphalt when we do this work, we should have enough funds in our reserves to accomplish this work without needing an additional assessment.
