Message from the President

Fall is here and pumpkins are popping out all over. I hope everyone had a great summer! The Village looks great with the new roofs, gutters, painted shutters and medallions and mulch!

Roofing project

The roofing project is essentially done. The last gutters were installed on Friday! This is well ahead of schedule! The final punch list will be done this week and the final details will be completed shortly thereafter. We are particularly pleased with KPI and the work they have done. Their materials and equipment will disappear soon.

The remaining issue is the deteriorated chimney caps. We are replacing six caps that leaked and caused the need for chimney repair, an unexpected cost. We feel the remaining chimney caps will start to leak over (short) time that could create needed roof repair on the 40 year roofs we just installed, so we are planning to replace **ALL** the chimney caps and do it this fall. I think all would agree that we must to complete the roofs properly!

We are accumulating all the extra costs, **including** the cost for the chimney caps, as we get them. We still have the hopes we will not need to do an additional

assessment to cover these additional costs.

The medallions over the garages have been repaired and painted and look great!

The Master Association has voted to remove the steep road above the sports area (and below Sullivan House) due to safety concerns. Our insurance company also paid a significant settlement for a fall due to the excessive slope that is also code non-compliant.

Proceeding without **signed** approval may require attention to make changes to comply with our **Rules and Regulations.**
