Roofing project

The roofing project is complete! The next project that is underway is the replacement of the chimney caps. As we get started on this, we will distribute a tentative schedule so no one will be surprised.

Budget/Assessments

The good news is that we will not need to supplement the past assessment for increased work required for the roofing project. We also feel we will not need to assess for the upcoming paving project that is estimated to be done in 2026 or 2027. The quarterly assessment will have to increase for the coming year due to costs we do **not** control. The main increases have come in our insurance, trash removal, and Master Association fees. This will be discussed at the annual Village Budget Meeting at 7:00 PM on December 5.

We remain one of the best funded villages with one of the lowest quarterly assessments in the Mill!


