Message from the President

I hope everyone had a great summer and has survived the roofing project. For those homes not yet completed, we are looking forward to their being done shortly.

Roofing project

The progress on the roofing project is going particularly well. We look forward to its completion in September, ahead of the October expected date. After a slow start because of rain and some lost days due to excessive heat, it has progressed particularly well!

We have had to do significantly more "repair" work and code required work than expected; thank you, Houvnanian! We have had to replace more roof sheathing (the plywood under the shingles) than planned, add more fire rated plywood between units to meet code, and re-pipe bath exhausts. The latest repair issue required is to replace all the chimney caps that have rusted through or are about to rust through. Water leaking at the caps rots out the chimney framing and roof sheathing and causes interior water damage. We have decided to replace all caps rather than wait until the damage is done.

With all these additional requirements, it obviously increases the total cost of the project. We will have all the costs shortly after completing the project. We hope to have enough in the reserves to cover these increases and not need to assess more funds at this time. I believe all would agree to complete this project properly and not try to skimp on a final product that would come back to haunt us.

Steve Keefer and Pierre Nolin, from the start, have been compiling detailed punch lists as

clusters are totally finished. That has produced significant benefits. One benefit is when we complete the last building, all previous buildings will be totally complete, and it will only be a short time to complete any remaining items. It also encourages the contractor to correct punch list items as they go, and the punch lists get significantly shorter as we continue through the village.

Medallions

The medallions over the garages are to be repaired and painted to complete our project for this fall.

Master Association

The Master Association has approved my project for a 24'x 44' pavilion at the sports area that is to be utilized by **all** groups in the Mill for functions by reservation. Two locations adjacent to the new bocce courts are being considered and the facility should be completed by early November.

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Yellow Dot Program

The rest is up to you! You need to fill out the proper paperwork as detailed in the plan, apply the yellow dots as directed, and put the paperwork in the locations as described. It is important and can save your life.

Mailboxes

Some mailboxes are becoming faded and can be rejuvenated by cleaning. This will not be addressed this summer with all the other work being done but could be helped if homeowners are able to give cleaning a try.

Exterior Changes

Keep in mind that **any changes** you wish to make to the exterior of your unit, whether to the structure or the landscaping, must be **signed off by Council**. Contacting the Architectural or Landscaping committees for input and/or advice on the product or procedure will help move your project forward. Proceeding without signed approval may require attention to make changes to comply with our **Rules and Regulations**.
