Roofing Project

The final, added phase in the roofing project is the replacement of the chimney caps. This phase is scheduled to start the first week of January with the first 18 caps. Once we see how this goes, we will be able to put together a rough schedule for the remaining ones-all will be replaced!

Budget/Assessments

The good news is, we will not need to supplement the past assessment for increased work required for the roofing project. We also feel we will not need to assess for the upcoming paving project that is estimated to be done in 2026 or 2027. The notification and payment coupons have been sent out for 2025 with the January 1, 2025 payment of \$1,938 now due.
