Residents of Jefferson Village are following stay-at-home guidelines. When leaving homes to walk dogs or simply to get some fresh air, all take care to remain 6 feet apart, most wearing masks, taking care not to unknowingly spread the virus.

We may all be stuck at home, but rest assured that village management continues to do all those tasks to keep our village looking its best and running smoothly.

Our managing agent, Steve Erney, remains on task daily, seeing to it that our contractors maintain scheduled services. Steve also makes sure that all resident issues have been resolved quickly. Village Council has remained proactive in overseeing current projects and in planning future ones. Here are a few updates on current projects:

- Siding work has been completed. KPI2 is currently shut down due to state regulations, but will return to correct punch list items once permitted to return to work.

- Painting of doors and other wood surfaces will resume when current restrictions are lifted.

- Stucco repairs to garages is ongoing, weather permitting.

- Dryer vent cleaning (1/3 of village) is ongoing. Smoke detector cleaning & battery replacement to take place after restrictions are lifted.

Jefferson Village Open Meeting & Election of Council Members Wednesday, May 27

The annual Open Meeting of village council and election of council members is scheduled to take place at the Community Center on May 27. However, Council is making plans to hold the meeting on line should current assembly restrictions remain in place, or if it appears that assembling to soon might be hazardous to the health of our residents.

If the meeting does take place at the Community Center, it will begin at 7:30pm following a social 'hour' at 7pm. If restrictions are not lifted, then the meeting will take place on-line in a Zoom Meeting. Full instructions will be forwarded to residents should a Zoom meeting be necessary.

There are three (3) Council positions open. Applications for those interested running for Council membership have been mailed out. Those wishing to run must return the application by May 1.
