**Premise Alert**

The Westtown-East Goshen Regional Police Department, in conjunction with the Chester County Department of Emergency Services, would like to remind citizens that our police department participates in the Premise Alert program. Premise Alert is a free, voluntary safety program that allows individuals and families to alert first responders (police, fire fighters, emergency medical service) to the special needs of individuals in their community and support families and individuals with disabilities, challenges or complex medical diagnosis in the event of a crisis. By providing first responders with advance knowledge, it allows for quick and educated responses during crises, evacuations, and disasters. The service is provided free of charge.
