From the Master Association

Elections were held for Council Board Members. Bob Bronner, George Earle, and Dennis O'Leary were elected to the Master Council.

<u>Elevator:</u> A contract was awarded to Weaver Contracting in the amount of \$300,000 for the new elevator at the Community Center.

<u>Road Repairs:</u> Work will begin on July 17th for repairs to be done in the areas around Chatham and Merrifield.

At the Robynwood/Springton Basin, work continues to replace pipe that needed repair under the road on Chandler.

Pipeline: Sunoco continues drilling from Wellington to Route 202. A pilot hole is complete.

COMMITEE REPORTS

Architectural / Building Committee Report

The Building Committee and the Council are pleased to report that Remediation work has begun in Upper Robynwood. In one week's time, all of the remediated walls have been torn down on Building 14 (1312-1315) and East Goshen town inspectors have approved the work

(inspection performed 7-15). Scaffolding has been placed around Building 15 (1316-1319) in preparation for work to begin within the next 24 - 48 hours.

Week 2 will result in tearing down walls on Building 15 and meetings with residents will be scheduled for the next Building (Building 16).

We are all very pleased with the quality of work and the attention to detail exhibited by members of McDermott Construction. They are all very courteous and willing to make our Remediation as pleasant as possible.

Although there is a degree of inconvenience involved with such an undertaking, we are enjoying the transition this year knowing that a new, revitalized Robynwood is just around the corner. More to come!!!

Finance Committee

For the period ending June 30, we are on target and within \$1,000 of our budgeted 2019 Operating expense of \$781,250.

The Finance Committee met on July 17th to review a draft of the 2018 Robynwood Audit that is performed each year. Several questions and suggestions were raised by the committee. A meeting with the auditor has been requested for July 25th to review these suggestions.

Landscape Committee

The Council has recently approved the pruning of 18 of our largest trees. We worked along with Mike Neale who said Arader Tree Service should be able to complete the work by the end of July.

As you water your flower gardens please keep in mind to also water well any new tree or shrub plantings especially during this heat wave.

Home sales in the Mill are doing very well. Currently there are 17 "Active" listings ranging in price from \$210,000 to \$699,000. There are 18 homes "Pending" or "Under Contract" and 17 homes have "Settled" in the last 30 days

Robynwood is very busy, as well. The home at 1271 Robynwood is "Under Contract." Currently "Active" are 1288 Robynwood, \$500,000; 1290 Robynwood, \$430,000; 1294 Robynwood, \$550,000; 1292 has been "Withdrawn." We have a really great Village and many wonderful friends.
