

Village of Robynwood Newsletter September 2020

From the Council

Fall is upon us and our remediation project is complete except for some missing shutters which are on backorder.

The leaves have started to turn color and are beginning to fall. Hopefully, we can settle into fall and winter and begin planning for a fast-paced-spring and summer in Robynwood.

Status of Alarm System Replacement

Replacement of the alarm systems in Upper Robynwood is completed.

The replacement program in Middle Robynwood started on July 29, 2020. New alarm panels were installed in 19 of 27 homes in Middle.

We were advised on September 3rd, 2020, that both the distributor and the factory were depleted of alarm panels due to the Covid-19 outbreak and as of this time, they do not know when additional panels will be available. Based upon this information, it was decided that Jarman would begin the installation of the additional required smoke detectors in the 19 homes. As of September 15, 2020, 8 homes in Middle are finished.

From the Master Association

The Master Association is working with PECO regarding the power outage and the length of time the power is out in the Mill. More information will be provided as soon as it becomes available.

Curbing work is being done around the Mill. The 2020 paving project for road improvements will begin shortly.

The elevator at the community center is complete and in use.

The Master Association is currently working on the 2021 budget.

The Pipeline Project in front of the shopping center is coming to an end.

Architectural Committee/Building Committee

Roof Replacement is our next project. The committee is interviewing roofing contractors and will share progress with Village residents when roofing candidates submit their bids and a contractor is selected.

Finance Committee

Now that the remediation project has been completed, we expect that the final project cost will be approximately \$30,000 under our budget estimate of \$2,650,000. We are also forecasting to have a capital reserve fund balance of \$990,000 in January of 2021. This money will be used to start the roofing project next year as planned.

Last week, Council voted and approved entering into a contract with Bustamante Engineers Inc to perform a Capital Reserve Fund Study for Robynwood Village. The last study was done in 1998 and hasn't been updated since. Once completed, the study should be updated approximately every 5 years to make sure there will be sufficient funds available when a major common area item needs replacement. Examples of these items are concrete walkways, asphalt paving, geothermal wells, siding/painting of homes, and lighting fixtures to name a few. The cost of the study is \$3,500 and necessary to maintain property values and minimize the need for special assessments. For instance, if a particular village has insufficient reserve funds, educated homebuyers may not want to invest in the community. In addition, lenders looking for signs of financial health may hesitate to approve mortgage applications in such a community. We expect the study to be completed in the 4th quarter of this year.

Maintenance Committee

In addition to assisting with the final phase of our remediation project, we are in the process of replacing 27 rusted trash closet doors in middle and lower Robynwood and repainting those that were badly faded.

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The deteriorated house number sign on Chandler at lower Robynwood has been replaced as well.

We will continue to make upgrades to your village as the budget permits. Please remember that CSK is the point of first contact if you see a maintenance issue that requires attention.

Currently there are 9 "Active" listings in Hershey's Mill. Prices are ranging from \$224,900. to \$550,000. This is the lowest inventory in many years for the Mill. There are 9 homes "Under Contract/Pending" and 12 homes have "Settled" in the last 30 days.

Homes in Robynwood: 1288 Robynwood "Settled" July 31st for \$455,000. Also, 1292 Robynwood (listed for \$599,900) is "Pending" and scheduled to settle on October 9th. 1326 Robynwood (listed for \$499,000) is "Under Contract"; no settlement date is determined yet.
