ASHTON VILLAGE PROJECT UPDATES

- Railings and Guardrails have been repaired or replaced and painted as needed.
- Trash Reminders:
 - Free bulk trash pick up is the first Tuesday of each month (except holidays). We are allowed 1 bulk item per home, per month. The item must be placed outside by the trash cabinets the evening before. No large appliances, propane or hazardous waste. Please do not leave large items sitting outside at any other time, unless you have arranged to have it picked up at your own cost.

 - If the item is not picked up, please contact Steve Erney at PENCO.
- Storm drains were cleaned in June.
- Power washing has started this year. A new approach has been adopted and approved by Council to fit our budget. It will be phased out over 3 years, one section of the Village per year. Each house will be done every third year. Phase One started at the top of the hill where it was the worst. All homeowners can opt to have their house (when it is not your year) and/or patio done as needed at your own expense while the company is working here onsite.
- Window cleaning at the Quads will be done yearly.

- **Gutter Cleaning** cleaning of the gutters is underway.
- **Summer Pruning** DiStefano has started the summer pruning of non-flowering bushes. They will also trim tree branches leaning on homes.

HOUSEHOLD TIPS & TRICKS

As we know, our infrastructure (water and waste lines) is 50 years old. So let's talk about what <u>NOT</u> to put down our garbage disposals:

- Coffee grounds
- Banana peels or onion peels
- Egg shells
- Pineapple rinds
- Lemon, orange or lime rinds
- Bones of any kind
- Grease or oil of any kind
- Large amounts of refuse at once

All of these will clog your pipes and drains.

Hint: use Dawn or a good grease-cutting detergent and maintain with an enzyme cleaner once or twice a month to keep those drains clean.

Your garbage disposal and your pipes will thank vou!

Dryer Vents


If you haven't had your dryer vents cleaned, please do so. Send a copy of the receipt to PENCO.


Between 10:00 AM - 2:00 PM, all Ashtonians are welcome to walk around from garage to garage and take whatever tickles your fancy.

Paint Trim Colors in Ashton

As an HOA community, we all know there are uniformity requirements in place for the purpose of the aesthetics of our Village. The main purpose for this is to maintain and increase our property values. One of the requirements is the color of the outside trim around doors and windows.

- Window colors dark bronze.
- Trim must match the siding (exception: those windows replaced at the time khaki was approved).
- Screens and patio doors bronze or dark brown.
- WHITE or any other color is NOT acceptable and must be replaced.
- For those with white, we will contact you with instructions on painting and/or replacing.
- Our Village is a source of pride for all of us - let's work together to keep it that way!
